



Dear Friends,

It would be an understatement to say that 2020 was an unusual year. In March, our lives changed almost overnight, as many of us began working remotely and limiting our contact with our friends and family members. Several of Exodus's clients, including those who had been self-sufficient for years, found themselves dealing with unexpected job losses and isolation.

With your help, Exodus quickly pivoted and began providing services virtually. We helped clients navigate new challenges, like quarantining when they first arrived in the United States, understanding the virtual platforms they would need for work and school, and understanding changing health orders and information. Demand for services like English classes and mental health services soared, and our employment team kept busy helping clients who had been laid off to find new jobs.

Despite these challenges, your support allowed us to provide services to 939 clients in 2020, including 175 clients who were newly resettled in our community. As these clients began new lives in the midst of a global crisis, I was reminded that when we come together to support refugees, incredible things can happen.

With immigration policies swiftly changing, Exodus is prepared to welcome hundreds more refugees in the coming year. Fortunately, I know that we have the backing of donors, volunteers, and other supporters like you. Together, we will work to welcome these refugees into our community.






Even though 2020 was a difficult year, we were able to welcome 175 refugees from six countries. These clients had the opportunity to start new lives here in Central Indiana.




