2022 was a busy year at Exodus! The refugee resettlement program finally began to recover from years of neglect and pandemic-related delays, which means more refugees will be free to begin again in Indiana.

We hired our first staff for our Bloomington sub-office and rented space, expanding our services to a new city in Indiana! The Bloomington community has been incredibly welcoming to our clients, giving them the support they need to build new lives in Indiana. In 2022, 44 clients were resettled by our Bloomington office. In the future, even more refugees will arrive in the community to begin building new lives there.

We also continued to welcome Afghan evacuees to our community, and continued to provide supportive services like legal assistance, mental wellness assistance, extended case management, women's programming, youth programming, and more to help them adjust to life in Indiana. Welcoming hundreds of Afghans to our community after years of low arrivals was a challenge, but with your help, Exodus was able to provide assistance to more than 400 evacuees who arrived in late 2021 and early 2022.

As we look back on 2022, we also want to look forward to what the future may hold. As conflicts around the world continue to escalate in countries like Burma, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Sudan, Ukraine, and so many others, the refugee resettlement program is more important than ever before. Fortunately, because of the support of donors, volunteers, and advocates like you, Exodus will be able to meet this challenge and provide services to those in need.






