As we move through 2024, we see that immigration has once again become a politically charged topic, as fear and misinformation cloud the news cycle.

In times like these, it is more important than ever to look back on the successes we had in 2023 and to celebrate all of the asylum seekers, refugees, and other displaced people who made Indianapolis their new home. Families were reunited, students graduated from high school, refugees found jobs and began supporting their families, and refugees became citizens for the first time!

Nationally, we saw that the resettlement program continued to recover from its years of neglect under the previous presidential administration. 75,047 refugees came to the country in 2023, and 1,566 of those came to Indiana. This was a significant increase from the last few years and shows that our country continued to take steps toward once again becoming a global leader in refugee resettlement.

Here in Indiana, Exodus served over 3,000 refugees and other humanitarian immigrants, 895 of whom were new arrivals! With your help, we are working to ensure that Indianapolis and Bloomington are welcoming communities for these newly arrived refugees who are starting over here in Indianapolis. 


